#### **INTRODUCTION**

God does not promise that the path of the disciple will be easy. Jeremiah feels the pain of rejection from those who do not want to hear what he has to say. Jesus declares that his words may bring stark division. Even so, we need not be afraid for God accounts for each hair on our heads. Though we may experience rejection, frustration, division, and death, God’s grace and love make us a new creation each day. Marked with the cross and filled with holy food, we are sent from worship to witness to Christ in the world.

#### **GATHERING**

#### **CENTERING AND INVOCATION**

P. Jesus had a rich prayer life. Whether it was public prayers and blessings or private prayers on the mountain or in the garden, praying was a deeply connecting practice for him. Sometimes prayer can be a bit abstract for us. We may not be sure about incorporating it into our lives. We know it is part of our Christian tradition and we practice it here in our sanctuary. But we may not be as sure about what it can mean for us outside of worship. That’s ok. Jesus’ disciples weren’t sure either and so they asked him to help them. He gave his disciples a template for ways to relate to God in prayer. In this new worship series, we are going to sink deep into the “when, where, what, and why” of prayer as Jesus showed his disciples.

We arrive fully into this moment, Holy One. We open to sense your presence among us. We hear you say,  
**“Be still and know.”**

We need you, Jesus, to help us. We come to you as your first disciples did. We hear you say,

**“Be still and know.”**

Spirit of Divine Love, Come to us with your healing waters. We hear you say, **“Be still and know.”**

P. I invite us to a few moments of silence. Feel your rhythms slow a bit. You were given a strand of prayer beads when you arrived. Simply hold those in your hands. Feel the textures with no need to figure anything else out about them right now. Just “be still and know....” meaning, listen to whatever is in your heart.

*Silence*

P. Take a deep breath. You are allowed to simply “be” in your life sometimes. “Be still” sometimes. Because when we do, we can finally hear what we know about the Holy deep inside of us. Let us worship God, follow Christ, and revel in the Spirit of Presence in this place. Let us rise and sing together:



Lord, lis-ten to your chil-dren pray-ing, Lord, send your Spir-it in this place;



Lord, lis-ten to your chil-dren pray-ing, send us love, send us pow'r, send us grace.



## THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

P. Holy are you, and blessed is your Son Jesus Christ. He came to teach us how close you are to us. He came to remind us that our work is this:

***“Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.”***

And so, your Spirit anointed him to preach good news to the poor, to proclaim release to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, and to announce that the time had come when you would save your people. He healed the sick, fed the hungry, and ate with sinners.

By the baptism of his suffering, death, and resurrection you gave birth to your church, delivered us from slavery to sin and death, and made with us a new covenant by water and the Spirit.

When the Lord Jesus ascended, he promised to be with us always, in the power of your Word and Holy Spirit.

Jesus used the most common of items to remind us that all gifts come from God, including the gift of unending grace.

***“Give us this day our daily bread.”***

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Even as he said these things, he knew that he would be betrayed. And yet he forgave. We ask for God’s help to accomplish this in our own lives:

***“Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.”***

And so, in remembrance of your mighty acts in Jesus Christ, we offer ourselves as a holy and living sacrifice, in union with Christ’s offering for us, as we proclaim the mystery of faith.

**Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.**

The Holy Spirit gives us the courage to do the right thing even when it is difficult. We pray:

***“Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.”***

And so we ask you, God to pour out your Holy Spirit on us gathered here, and on these gifts of bread and wine. Make them be for us the body and blood of Christ, so that we may be for the world the body of Christ, redeemed by his blood.

By your Spirit make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world, until Christ comes in final victory and we feast at his heavenly banquet.

***“For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever and ever.”***

Through your Son Jesus Christ with the Holy Spirit in your holy church, all honor and glory is yours, almighty God, now and forever. **Amen.**

#### **INVITATION TO COMMUNION**



We are off to a slow start to earn a second bench from NexTrex, but we still have plenty of time. We need to submit 1,000 pounds of plastic wrap and bags within a 12-month period. To achieve that goal, we should be averaging 83 pounds per month, currently **we've collected 96 pounds in our first two months** of this new cycle. Please collect from your friends and families to help increase our numbers while helping to keep this plastic out of our landfills.

**Food Pantry: Food items to help restock:** 4-pack toilet paper, pasta sauce, canned tuna, boxed cereal, canned chili, canned corn, canned green beans, peanut butter, jelly, children's juice boxes or pouches, and body wash. You can always bring donations of canned goods, paper goods, and hygiene products. All donations can be **placed in the blue bin** by the sanctuary doors. Thank you!

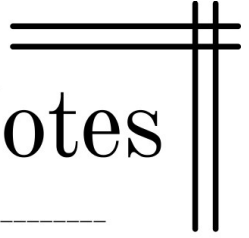

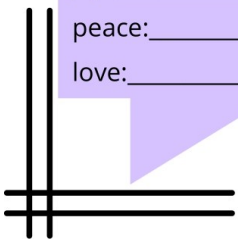
